Purple Area – Proposed Camping area for July 11 to 14 (July 10 part of the field in the southwest corner is being used)

Yellow Area – Chief Joe Mathias Centre (CJMC)

Orange Area – Standard vehicle parking

Green Area – Porta-potties site

Blue Area – RV and trailer parking, parking at CJMC is also permitted – Please limit RV use if possible

Black Dots – Best walking path from camp to CJMC

There will be limited shower facilities at CJMC. Options for showers will be at the following locations in order of proximity to camp.

- Lions Gate Community Recreation Centre - 1733 Lions Gate Ln, North Vancouver - From camp (walking distance): Head north on Capilano Rd, past the intersections at Marine Dr and Curling Rd, left at Fullerton Ave then left at Lionsgate Ln. Continue down Fullerton for the facilities underground parking.
- West Vancouver Community Centre & Aquatic Centre - 2121 Marine Dr, West Vancouver – From camp: (drive) Head north on Capilano Rd, turn left on Marine Dr and follow for 3.5km, turn right on 21st St, access to underground parking off of traffic circle of Fulton and 21st
